Amphetamines can be useful for many medical problems. For example, doctors often use them to treat narcolepsy and attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder (ADHD). However, when people begin abusing these medications, dependency can often follow and spiral out of control. What Are Amphetamines?

Amphetamines are synthetic drugs that stimulate activity in the central nervous system. They increase

alertness, energy, and energy. However, they also increase your respiratory rate, heart rate, and blood pressure. Doctors may prescribe brand-name amphetamines, such as:

Adderall

Desoxyn

Dexedrine

Vyvanse

If you were to take a pill form of amphetamines, you would get a mild high. However, if you crush the pill and snort them, the high comes faster and is more potent. Moreover, people can also dissolve the powdered form in water and inject it. This method is the most intense.

Some teens use amphetamines as a study aid in order to get high energy and focus as they study for a test. However, this does not always lead to an improvement in grades. Sometimes, they may get distracted by small, meaningless tasks, such as cleaning their rooms, preventing them from studying at all. Conversely, they may complete their studying but come off the drug, leading to a crash in focus and energy when they need to be taking the test.

Additionally, other teens may use the drug solely to get high. Nonetheless, whatever the reason, it is vital for them to get help at an adolescent amphetamine use treatment program.

Effects of Amphetamines

Amphetamines cause a variety of health effects. For example, in addition to the increased heart rate and blood pressure, high doses of amphetamines can lead to high body temperature, seizures, and heart failure. Moreover, people who use amphetamines over a long period can become paranoid or irrationally angry. Additionally, amphetamines can cause psychosis. If your teen injects amphetamines, they can contract blood-borne diseases, such as hepatitis or HIV.

Another risk when your teen misuses amphetamines is that they will overdose. There are a variety of signs of overdose, including:

- Restlessness
- Overactive reflexes
- Tremors
- Rapid breathing

- Aggression
- Confusion
- Hallucinations
- High fevers

- Panic states
- Weakness
- Muscle pain

An overdose can lead to a heart attack, high or low blood pressure, convulsions, poisoning, circulation failure, or coma. Therefore, it's critical to get treatment at an adolescent amphetamine use treatment program to avoid the risk of your teen overdosing.
